Hello Coal Creek Community,

We are beyond thankful for the outpouring of support for those impacted in our community and staff. As many of you know, we have a large number of families who have lost their homes completely or have severe damage. We also have families who have been impacted with being displaced while the logistics and restoration process gets set up. Please continue to give grace and keep our school community in your thoughts as everyone is finding housing, developing routines, new travel routes and the new normal.

As I was talking with the students on the morning announcements to start school on Wednesday morning, one of the things I shared was a lesson from Mister Rogers. He famously said he was always comforted by something his mother would tell him during times of disaster. "When I was a boy and I would see scary things in the news, my mother would say to me, "Look for the helpers. You will always find people who are helping." Well, I am in awe and inspired by the positive impact from the efforts of our helpers....the first responders, our PTA, parent leaders/volunteers, businesses both local and global, CCE & BVSD staff, neighboring school districts, houses of worship and our local community combined with those from around the world. The connections, donations, offerings of words of support, volunteering time/energy and tremendous resources to meet the physical and emotional needs of our community, combined is what makes a difference. I hear time and time again that these acts of kindness and generous donations are incredibly appreciated by our families and beyond. Thank you, thank you, thank you!

The BVSD Trauma Response Team are our helpers too as has been a strong support for our students and staff this week at CCE and across our impacted community. They began providing support on Monday/Tuesday at the Education Center and joined our efforts on Wednesday at Coal Creek. The team will also be back at CCE on Monday, January 10th. Students and staff have an open door policy and can access this counseling support at any point needed during the school day.

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In preparation for required emergency drills, I wanted to let you all know that the Fire Marshals in both jurisdictions are giving BVSD an exemption from having physical fire drills in all Superior and Louisville schools for January. In absence of doing an evacuation and full drill, our staff and Emergency Response Team will be having discussions, covering logistics, reviewing the evacuation points and understanding everyone's responsibilities during the event (communication, student safety, accountability/attendance, securing their rooms etc.)

If you are impacted in anyway, I am including the following information related to the new **Disaster Assistance Center** (NOW OPEN) and ongoing recovery websites:

The Boulder County Disaster Assistance Center, located at the Boulder County Southeast County Hub at [1755 South Public Road in Lafayette](#), will operate from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m., seven days a week, and will include specialists from Boulder County Housing and Human Services, Public Health, Community Services and Community Planning & Permitting, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), Mental Health Partners, many other area government and nonprofit organizations, and insurers.

Help Available at the Disaster Assistance Center:

- Consultation on property loss and filing claims for assistance
- Gift cards for replacement of food and transportation costs
- Information about short- and long-term housing
- Help with vital records
- Referrals to emergency shelter
- Food assistance
- Mental health services
- COVID-19 tests

- Referrals for personal finance planning

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Free Bikes for those affected by Marshall Fire:

Community Cycles will be offering FREE bikes for transportation to people who suffered losses in the Marshall Fire. The bikes offered are best suited for everyday transportation. "The bikes Community Cycles sells and provides to the public are mostly bikes for getting around town. We won't be able to replace the high-end mountain, road, or gravel bike you train on, but we can help you get around town on a sturdy used bike." If you are in need, apply for a bike by contacting: firebikes@communitycycles.org. Please provide your height, address, and a brief explanation of how you will be using the bike. The bikes will be distributed based on need. Not all sizes or styles may be available, as Community Cycles begins with bikes donated by the community and then refurbishes them with a team of professional and volunteer mechanics.

Counselor's Corner

Hello Coal Creek Families,

Let me start this letter by offering my thoughts and wishes for this community. Students have come back only a few days and yet it is clear how resilient, cohesive, empathetic, and caring this community is for each other. Those skills are learned through modeling from their families, and you should take a massive amount of pride in yourselves for the compassion and resilience these children have shown in their return to learning at Coal Creek. I hope to share some current happenings going on here at Coal Creek for this month, along with some resources that I hope will help you in continuing to support your Puma's social-emotional well-being outside of school.

Current Happenings at Coal Creek

Much like last semester, Zones of Regulation curriculum will be continued in the classrooms. The recent fire and evacuation had and will have an emotional toll for ourselves, and our students. Our students may not be able to put words to the emotions they are feeling, but even by just saying the color they are in, they will be able to identify where they are at. The benefit of these colored zones gives teachers, me, and you as parents the opportunity to check-in, and, based on the color, offer support or tools to give your child as they continue on with their current day-to-day situations. With this information, Coal Creek will continue to push the Zones terminology and give students multiple opportunities through the day to "check their temperature" based on the Zones. 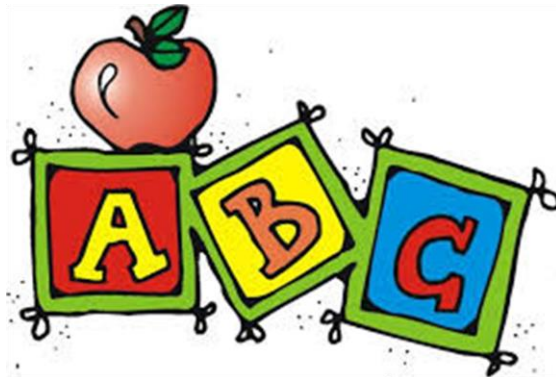

- [JFS Boulder County Crisis Counseling](#): In response to multiple tragic events over the last year, Jewish Family Service and Community Foundation Boulder County have partnered to offer counseling services to Boulder County residents. The program offers up to \$500 towards five individual counseling sessions (a maximum of \$100 per session), or up to \$875 towards five family counseling sessions (a maximum of \$175 per session) and provides a pool of licensed providers from which to choose.
